# The Pew Perspective

When the Lord called Moses from the burning bush to a new chapter in his life of service and ministry, Moses was not excited about the prospect. For forty years Moses had tended the flock of Jethro in Midian, having fled from Egypt and given up his former life as the son of Pharoah's daughter. But God was not through with Moses. Five times Moses gave the Lord reasons why He had selected the wrong person for the task of bringing the children of Israel out of Egypt. And five times, the Lord answered Moses.

Moses' first objection was that he was not important enough: "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh..." (Exodus 3:11)? Moses felt unqualified, no longer of royal status to be worthy of challenging the most powerful king in the world. But God said, "I will certainly be with you" (Exodus 3:12), promising Moses all the power and authority he would need.

Again, Moses protested, "what shall I say to them" (Exodus 3:13)? Moses felt he wasn't smart enough, not a well-trained theologian to teach Israel about God or lead the nation. But the Lord told Moses, "...Thus you shall say to the children of Israel..." (Exodus 3:14), giving Moses the first of many instructions and guidance.

A third time, Moses challenged God's plan of leading Israel, asking "...But suppose they will not believe me..." (Exodus 4:1). Moses wasn't brave enough to face God's challenge, but the Lord supplied Moses everything he needed. From turning Moses' rod into a serpent to granting him the ability to perform miraculous signs (Exodus 4:2-9), God empowered Moses to be His representative.

Moses' fourth excuse was that he was "not eloquent", slow of speech and tongue (*Exodus 4:10*). But God reminded Moses that He created his mouth and would give Moses the words to say before both Israel and Egypt (*Exodus 4:11-12*).

With all previous excuses exhausted, Moses finally admitted he just didn't want to obey the Lord: "...please send by the hand of whomever else You may send" (Exodus 4:13). It was at that point that the Lord got angry with Moses, and allowed his brother Aaron to serve as his mouthpiece (Exodus 4:14-17).

More often than not, God does not call the prepared, He prepares the called. From the Lord selecting the fearful Gideon and calling him a "mighty man of valor" (Judges 6:12). to Jesus tapping the turbulent apostle Simon Peter as His "rock" (Matthew 16:18), God has a habit of calling us, His children, from where we are and maturing us into the faithful servants He knows we can be. Through trials and tears, challenges and opportunities, God stretches and strengthens us to complete His perfect will. As a good Vinedresser, the Lord who loves us prunes us to bear Him even more fruit (John 15:1-10). Here in our new chapter of service to the Lord at Barnesville Baptist Church, each of us is being called to service and sacrifice. Our season of transition between our past blessing and the blessing the Lord has in store for us is a time to seek Him closer, pray more fervently, trust Him more faithfully, and obey Him more urgently. If the Lord lays on your heart a burden to participate, to share, or to serve, then now is the time to put up your hand, set aside any excuses, and follow the Lord's will for the next chapter of your life and our church.

## **Business Meeting Briefs**


Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in January:

- The Treasurer submitted his Annual Report on the 2023 fiscal year.
- The Pastor appointed the Deacons to serve as the Select Committee on Auditing, which will review the 2023 finances and report at the March 2024 Business Meeting.

*Expected at the February Business Meeting:* 

- The Nominating Cmte. will recommend the following members to serve for the remainder of the 2022-2024 term: Ellen Williams as Children's Sunday School Teacher and Children's Church Coordinator on the Education Cmte., vice Cindy Moore, resigned; and Donna Belcher as Fellowship Coordinator on the Outreach Cmte., vice Cindy Moore, resigned.
- In light of the Pastor's resignation effective Jan. 31, 2024, a Pastor Search Committee will be formed. The Deacons, acting as a Nominating Cmte., will recommend the following members to serve: Deacons: Lee Michael; Education: Ellen Williams; Finance: David Bennett; Outreach: Donna Belcher; Internal Administration: Larry Michael; Worship: Luke Fedders; and Congregation: Jan Burdette.
- A motion from the Internal Administration Cmte. to reduce the Pastor budget line item by \$15,000 and establish a Pastoral Transition budget line item of \$15,000 will be offered.
