The Pastor Searchlight

On behalf of the Pastor Search Committee (PSC), we thank you for providing input through the congregation survey. Your responses will be used to help shape the way the PSC evaluates applications and interviews potential pastoral candidates.

During the month of April, the PSC will review the survey responses and create our position advertisement and application form. Our position advertisement will be sent to the MBA, BCM/D and SBC pastor search pages, as well as with the Southeastern and Southern seminaries. This will allow us to reach potential candidates throughout the region as well as graduates and alumni from the seminaries.

After receiving applications, the PSC will narrow down to candidates we believe are best matched and suited to serving at BBC and will schedule additional rounds of questions and then interviews with the most promising applicants.

Continue to pray for God's will and for patience during the pastor search process. The timing and pace of our search is ultimately in God's hands. We will continue to move ahead but we don't want to rush or skip over important steps and select the wrong person in an effort to finish sooner.

This transitional time is a good opportunity to consider how God wants you to participate in the life of BBC. What are your talents and spiritual gifts that He has blessed you with? How could you use them to serve Him here at BBC and in His Kingdom? VBS is coming in July--how might you volunteer to help in our largest evangelistic outreach of the year?

Please pray for unity within the church and that God will continue to provide support for the church during our transition. Also pray for the PSC for wisdom and guidance as we move through the process. Also pray for our next pastor. Pray that God is preparing him now to receive God's call to service here at BBC.

The Pew Perspective

Many Gospel accounts are about people who joyfully believed in Jesus: those whom He healed of terrible diseases, delivered from demon possession, and gave hope and forgiveness. It is easy to understand why they believed in Jesus and accepted His claims to divinity. But there are also those whose road to faith in Christ was much more difficult, who finally accepted that Jesus is Lord not because they wanted to, but because the fact that Jesus was the Son of God could not be denied.

Among those who were not easily impressed by Jesus were His own earthly brothers, the sons of Joseph & Mary. Just as the sons of Isaac were jealous of and hated their younger brother Joseph, it is easy to imagine that Jesus' younger siblings resented their literally holier-than-thou oldest brother. Jesus was the perfect sibling who never did anything wrong, who was never scolded or disciplined by his parents, and who was constantly held up as a role model of morality and correct behavior. And at the age of 30, Jesus stopped supporting His widowed mother to become a traveling religious teacher and started claiming to be the Son of God and a miracle worker. It's no wonder that Jesus' brothers considered Him weird at best and insane at worst.

The Gospels record three times how Jesus' brothers rejected Him and His message. In Mark 3:21, they questioned Jesus' mental health: "But when His own people heard about this, they went out to lay hold of Him, for they said, 'He is out of His mind". Again in Mark 6:3-4, Jesus' neighbors and relatives in Nazareth rejected Jesus, saying, "Is this not the carpenter, the Son of Mary, and brother of James. Joses. Judas, and Simon? And are not His sisters here with us?' So they were offended at Him. But Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is not without honor except in his own country, among his own relatives, and in his own house". According to John 7:1-5, Jesus' siblings were so hostile that they urged Him to go into Judea where they knew His enemies sought to kill Jesus: "After these things Jesus walked in Galilee; for He did not want to walk in Judea, because the Jews sought to kill Him. Now the Jews' Feast of Tabernacles was at hand. His brothers therefore said to Him, 'Depart from here and go into Judea, that Your disciples also may see the works that You are doing. For no one does anything in secret while he himself seeks to be known openly. If You do these things, show Yourself to the world.' For even His brothers did not believe in Him". Again, the parallel between Jesus' brothers and Joseph's brothers is striking: both sets of siblings were so enraged at their brother that they would say or do anything to get rid of him forever. Jesus' siblings were conspicuously absent at His death. Jesus, dying upon the cross, entrusted His widowed mother Mary to His apostle John, the only follower who had not abandoned Him (John 19:26-27). There was no time or opportunity to seek out His relatives in Nazareth, so Jesus put His mother's welfare into the hands of a close friend because His family members were nowhere to be found. Indeed, the four Gospels close with no further mention of Jesus' siblings.

And yet, we find in *Acts 1:14* that the entire family is assembled together with the apostles and the rest of Jesus' followers in the Upper Room, waiting for the Holy Spirit to

descend upon them as promised by Christ: "These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with His brothers." What happened between the contempt and hatred for their brother found in the Gospels and the display of faith and obedience at the beginning of Acts?

We must turn to Paul for the answer, who recorded an early statement of faith in the resurrected Christ recorded *in I Corinthians 15:3-8*: among those who saw Jesus risen from the dead was <u>James</u>, listed as an eyewitness to the resurrection along with Peter, the apostles, and Paul himself. We aren't given much detail about James or his brothers, but his encounter with the risen Christ completely transformed his life. Indeed, both James and Jude wrote New Testament epistles. James began his by describing himself not as Jesus' brother but as "...a bondservant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ..." (James 1:1), as did Jude, who called himself "...a bondservant of Jesus Christ, and brother of James...". Jesus was no longer their strange older brother, He was eternal God in the flesh, their Lord and Savior.

The radical change in James' and Jude's lifelong attitude toward Jesus is important for us because they were least likely to accept Jesus, having grown up with a bias against Him. Only the undeniable evidence of the resurrection could melt their hearts and send them on a path of worship and devotion. James was described in later life by Paul in *Galatians 2:9* as a pillar of the Jerusalem church. Much like Paul's own journey of faith, James' and Jude's path to belief in Jesus was hardwon and shows us that historical truth of the resurrection can change hearts, minds, and lives for eternity.
