The Pastor Searchlight

As of June 15, the Pastor Search Committee (PSC) will review all the applications for pastor that have been received thus far. That does not mean that we will stop accepting applications nor will we necessarily select a candidate from those applications that have been received. It is a date where we move into the next phase of the search process. Even if we do find candidates of interest, there will be multiple rounds of additional interviews, seeking references, verifying credentials, and listening to sermons and Bible studies to review and consider. The PSC's goal at the end of the entire search process is to present one candidate, God's candidate, to the congregation for approval. First and foremost, we are waiting on the Lord's timing and praying for Him to lead us to the man of His choosing. I Samuel 16:7 tells us "...For the Lord does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart".

In our Adult Sunday School class, we started a new study titled "Being an Authentic Church". Its message has an even deeper meaning and application for BBC as we are in the pastor search process. The first lesson is that an authentic church is built on Jesus Christ. That is what the church has been called to be and we need to continue to remind ourselves of that as we search for a pastor that shares that same desire. Please consider joining our Sunday School class.

At only five months in, we are still early in the search process. We are making good, steady progress, but we will take as long as needed to be confident that we have conducted a thorough and thoughtful search process so we can confidently recommend to the BBC membership the candidate that God has chosen for our next pastor.

The Deacons appreciate your continued prayer support for the pastor search process and for the continuing ministry of BBC.

The Pew Perspective

At BBC, our tradition has been to celebrate the Lord's Supper, or Communion, the first Sunday of each month. Jesus' final meal with his 12 apostles was the last time all of them fellowshipped together until after His resurrection. As part of our BBC celebration, the pastor most often recites *I Corinthians* 11:23-26, rather than one of the gospel accounts in Matthew 26, Mark 14, Luke 22, or John 13. What makes Paul's account of the event so interesting--and authoritative--is that he sources it not to any of the 12 apostles who were there with Jesus for the Last Supper, but rather to Christ Himself. I Corinthians 11:23 reads, "For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you...". The Apostle Paul encountered the resurrected and ascended Christ on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:5), after which Paul received direct instructtion from Christ about the gospel, to include a description of the Lord's Supper. "For I neither received [the gospel] from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through the revelation of Jesus Christ" (Galatians 1:12). Within Paul's account of the Lord's Supper are four key instructions for believers as they observe the ordinance: obey Christ's command, remember Christ's death, proclaim Christ's death until He comes, and examine one's life for unconfessed sin.

The first instruction about Communion is to practice it as an act of obedience to Christ. Recorded by all four Gospel writers as well as by Paul, Christ's command to regularly observe the practice was passed down from Him to His apostles, who passed it along to believers. Jesus gave instructions and explanations to the 12 as He went through the elements, describing what the bread meant and what the cup symbolized; we too today make it clear what we are doing and why we are doing it, just as we have been taught from Scripture.

The second instruction for the Lord's Supper is to use it as an opportunity to remember Christ's death--"do this in remembrance of Me" (I Corinthians 11:24). Especially for the 12 apostles, to recreate the last pre-crucifixion meal they shared with Jesus would be a power memory tool to recall that important event. Tasting and smelling the bread and the wine would help them remember that night. For future generations of Christians, chewing the bread and swallowing the juice gives us a very tangible means of participating in the ceremony that Jesus instituted for His disciples.

The third instruction for Communion is to use it as a public witness to the suffering and death of Christ for all to see each time we partake in it (*I Corinthians 11:26*). Just like baptism, communion is done in the open so that non-believers can understand what Christians believe and value. As we explain how the broken bread is like Jesus' pierced and bruised body that took on our sin, and how the grape juice symbolizes His blood that was poured out on the cross as a sacrifice, we are giving a gospel message. As Jesus said in *John 12:32*, "And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all peoples to Myself". Our role as Christ's followers is to point others to Him, and regularly observing Communion is a Jesus-approved and recommended way of helping people know who Jesus is and what He did for them.

The Pew Perspective, continued

The fourth instruction for the Lord's Supper is to first examine one's life for unconfessed sin before participating. Paul's description of Communion came in the middle of a rebuke of the Corinthians for making the Lord's Supper a time of disorderly behavior, with factions among the members, drunkenness, and even the poor people receiving no food while the rich feasted. Paul reproved the Corinthians for their unchristian behavior: "I do not praise you, since you come together not for the better but for the worse" (I Corinthians 11:17). Paul called for them to examine themselves and correct their behavior before receiving divine judgment, as some Corinthians fell ill or even died for their disgraceful practices (I Corinthians 11:30). It is interesting to note that during the first Lord's Supper, Judas Iscariot, who began implanting his plan to betray Jesus during the meal, soon died by his own hand not long after. The examples of what happened to Judas and to some of the Corinthians should impress upon us today the seriousness and importance of respecting one of Christ's ordinances for His Church and the necessity of treating it with holiness and reverence, to include preparing ourselves spiritually to participate with a good conscience before God.
