The Pastor Searchlight

In August, the Pastor Search Committee (PSC) was very engaged with our pastoral candidate and his wife. We had two Zoom interview sessions and one in-person meeting at BBC. We have completed our interview phase, having had four Zoom calls and one in-person visit.

During the meetings, the PSC asked the candidate and his wife questions on various topics such as preaching, theology, shepherding, self-discipline, sociableness, personality, family life, spiritual walk, ministry, leadership, and future goals and plans. The PSC also shared about BBC's major functions such as the worship service (including communion, baptism, music and streaming), missions, outreach, evangelism, children's ministries, Sunday School, VBS, communications, deacons, membership, finances, and business meetings.

During the in-person visit, the PSC gave the candidate and his wife a tour of the church, parsonage, and grounds. We even let them ring the church bell! We concluded our meeting in true BBC style, dinner with Dickerson Market fried chicken and plenty of homemade sides and desserts.

Once we concluded our interviews, we also completed criminal background and credit checks on the candidate along with verifying education and ordination information. There were no issues with any of the information that was received.

The PSC has prepared an employment contract and compensation package and are preparing to negotiate them with the candidate. Once the negotiations are completed, the PSC will make a formal announcement of the candidate and provide details on when the candidate will be visiting and preaching at BBC and when we expect to vote on calling the pastor to serve at BBC. This announcement will be made for at least two consecutive weeks prior to a vote by the membership.

The PSC looks forward to introducing the pastoral candidate and his wife to the church in the coming weeks. The Deacons appreciate your continued prayer for the pastor search process and for the ongoing ministry of BBC.

The Pew Perspective

BBC is approaching a leadership transition. As David Bennett discusses in the Pastor Searchlight column on page 1, the Pastor Search Cmte. (PSC) expects to introduce a pastoral candidate to the congregation in the near future. The PSC has been working steadily toward that goal since February and we look forward to sharing good news with you very soon.

The Scripture describes a number of leaders and successors: famous pairs like Moses and Joshua, Elijah and Elisha, and Paul and Timothy come to mind. These duos were known for their close work together, with the senior preparing the junior to eventually succeed him. Joshua had a 40-year apprenticeship under Moses in their wilderness wanderings and was well-trained to take the children of Israel into the Promised Land after Moses died (Numbers 27:18-23). Elisha was granted a double portion of Elijah's spirit before Elijah was taken up to heaven (II Kings 2:9), literally leaving behind his mantle of leadership for Elisha as well. Paul considered Timothy his son in the Lord and trained him as a preacher; the epistles named after Timothy attest to the close attention Paul gave to educating and encouraging Timothy as a pastor (I Timothy 1:9). Other leaders and successors had different experiences, with unplanned or sudden changes in leadership. Some replacements were specifically announced by the Lord, such as choosing David to replace Saul as king (I Samuel 16:1), and some happened by the will of man, such as the Roman governor Felix being replaced by Festus (Acts 24:27). Most of the examples about leadership succession in the Bible come from the Old Testament, describing how the kings of Israel and Judah came to their thrones, with most succeeding their fathers. Some of the most interesting stories in the Old Testament concern a good son replacing a wicked father, or vice versa, and the effects that godly or ungodly ruler had on Israel or Judah.

Here at BBC, we have been blessed over the last several pastorates to have elevated an associate pastor to the senior role, with both Pastor Randy Gilliam and Pastor Danny Moore having served in the number-two position before taking on the senior pastor position. Having known both men and experienced and participated in their ministries well in advance of their elevation, BBC members enjoyed an extra level of confidence in advancing them to the pastorate. We also enjoyed a certain amount of stability and continuity, with the new pastor building on the work of the former. "Thus says the Lord: 'Stand in the ways and see, and ask for the old paths, where the good way is, and walk in it; then you will find rest for your souls" (Jeremiah 6:16).

It will also be a blessing for BBC to start a new, fresh chapter, with a new pastor who can bring new ideas and new ways of doing things to refresh and revitalize our ministry. There will be growing pains as we learn more **Biblical Leaders and Successors Scramble**

Expected at the September Business Meeting:


 The Deacons will offer a motion to send a letter of membership transfer for Sam & Robin Berry to First Baptist Church of Damascus.
