The Pew Perspective

In the book of *Revelation*, John introduces a new set of interconnected titles to describe the Lord Jesus Christ: the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and End, and the First and the Last. The titles are used singly or together six times in *Revelation 1:8, 1:11, 1:17, 2:8, 21:6,* and *22:13.* All three are used in *Revelation 22:13,* where Jesus tells John, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End, the First and the Last." While alpha and omega are unique to the New Testament, being the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, the idea of God being at the start and finish of everything is well grounded in the Old Testament, especially in *Isaiah*.

The Old Testament uses the language of "first and last" and "beginning and end" to show God's eternal nature, that He is both outside and beyond time and yet also present for all time, throughout the generations and millennia. "Listen to Me, O Jacob, and Israel, My called: I am He, I am the First, I am also the Last" (Isaiah 48:12). In addition, the Scriptures also emphasizes that God's eternal nature is a unique quality of His divinity that no other creature shares. Generations of mankind will be born, live, and die, civilizations will rise and fall, but the everlasting God will remain, ageless and timeless. In *Isaiah* 44:6, the Lord reminds us that He is alone and unique: "Thus says the Lord, the King of Israel, and his Redeemer, the Lord of hosts: 'I am the First and I am the Last; besides Me there is no God". In Isaiah 41:4, God asks who can compare with His longevity: "Who has performed and done it, calling the generations from the beginning? I, the Lord, am the first; and with the last I am He". Again in Isaiah 46:9-10, God repeats the theme of His unrivaled ability to transcend past, present, and future, to bring future events into being: "Remember the former things of old, for I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like Me, declaring the end from the beginning and from ancient times things that are not yet done, saying, 'My counsel shall stand, and I will do all My pleasure". Along with God's timeless and unique nature, His ability to achieve all that His will desires is unlimited. There is no one who can challenge, delay, or prevent Him from accomplishing what He wants to do.

Returning to *Revelation*, it is not surprising that Christ uses those titles to identify Himself to John as God, the all-powerful and eternal One, Creator of the universe, the incarnate Word of God who came in flesh, and the returning King who will take His Church home. "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End," says the Lord, "who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty" (Revelation 1:8). In case it wasn't clear who was using those titles of Godhood, Jesus referred to Himself in Revelation 2:8 as "...the First and the Last, who was dead, and came to life...". No one but Jesus Christ, the Son of God, can claim to be both God Almighty and the One who died and returned to life, a clear reference to His resurrection power or death, hell, and the grave.

Jesus' claims of His eternal Godhood gave John comfort in the midst of the apocalyptic scenes that unfolded throughout *Revelation*. Despite the turmoil and trouble, John saw that Jesus' victory is assured and that righteousness will prevail over evil in the end. We too can rely on Jesus to see us through our lives, He who has been the same in the past, now in the present, and will be in the future.

- The Church elected Rev. Kevin Cullins as pastor, effective Nov. 1.

Report from the 153rd Annual Business Meeting in October:

- Lee Michael and Nita Roff were approved to serve as messengers to the 89th Montgomery Baptist Association Annual Meeting, held on Sunday, Oct. 20 at Olney Baptist Church.
- A motion from the Internal Administration Cmte. to decrease the Pastor BLI by \$5,000 and increase the Pastoral Transition BLI by \$5,000 was approved.
- A resolution to begin the annual budget process for 2025 was approved; the standing committees will report to the Treasurer by Sunday, Nov. 3.
- The Church voted to approve the Select Committee on Nominations' five slates of recommendations for 2024-2026 church officers and committee members.


